A day both painful and very emotional this afternoon at the trial of the attacks of November 13. The special court of Paris went over the attack at the Bataclan with a chilling story told by one of the investigators. He ended up in tears when the names of the 90 victims were announced. A short audio clip of 30 seconds was broadcast in which we hear the first shots.

Salah Abdeslam, the only survivor of the commando, will go back to court for his participation in the attacks in Brussels in 2016. This is what the Belgian federal prosecutor announced today. The trial will start next year - 6 years after the double attack at the airport and in the metro which caused 32 deaths and hundreds of people injured.

The Minister of the Interior Gérald Darmanin has just launched a procedure for the dissolution of a publishing company called Nawa, in Ariège. It is suspected of distributing several works legitimizing the jihad. Measures to freeze its assets were enforced yesterday. The association had been declared in the sub-prefecture of Pamiers in 2008, it had already been the target of searches following the attacks of November 2015 in Paris.

Tik Tok wants to put an end to the controversy. The application has just removed the Anti2010 hashtag from its platform. It had been used in videos which incited to mock, humiliate or even threaten students born in 2010 and who have entered middle school at the beginning of September. the Minister of Education Jean-Michel Blanquer condemns such cyberbullying.

And launched in 1981, the TGV celebrates its 40th birthday. The TGV is an industrial and human pride, said Emmanuel Macron.
