There is concern among alternative energy suppliers. The president of the National Association of retail energy operators reacted this morning following the government's announcement yesterday of a tariff shield on gas. The price of gas is increasing by 12.6% today, and this increase is capped for the whole winter.

A hundred demonstrations are planned today throughout France. Retirees are asking for an increase in retirement pensions, as well as increased hiring in the medico-social sector such as in nursing homes.

While visiting Chambéry yesterday, the Secretary of State for Tourism spoke of the possibility of opening ski resorts without any need for a health pass. This prospect relies on the condition that the health situation continues to improve.

The identity of the serial killer in the "Hail" case has been confirmed. The man found dead on Wednesday evening in the Gard is indeed the serial killer responsible for the rape and murder of several people in the 80s and 90s. He confessed his guilt in his suicide note, a confession that was confirmed last night by DNA analysis.

The end of the garbage collectors' strike in Marseille. A movement followed by 90 to 100% of employees for a week. Workers were protesting against the law of transformation of the public service, which would increase their working hours. The president of the Metropolis announced this morning that an agreement had been reached with the unions.

The 2022 baccalaureate calendar has been confirmed, with the first exams between March 14th and 16th for high school students in general and technological fields. The exams will focus on the two specialty courses. Philosophy exams will be on the 15th June. Students will then be called between June 20th and July 1st for the Grand oral.
