The measures related to the sanitary pass will not be reduced "before November 15", according to the government spokesperson, Gabriel Attal at the end of the Health Defense Council which was held this morning at the Elysée. The Covid booster vaccine was also discussed during the council. The government will follow the recommendations of the High Authority for Health, which recommends a 3rd dose of the anti-covid vaccine for caregivers. However, there will be no obligation.

And Covid tests will no longer be free from October 15. Non-vaccinated adults will soon have to pay from 22 euros for an antigenic test and 44 euros for a PCR test in pharmacies. If they are carried out in laboratories, the prices will range from 25 to 30 euros. They will however remain free for medical reasons.

Pfizer is asking for authorization to deliver its vaccine to children aged 5 to 11. The American laboratory has announced that it has filed a request with the US Medicines Agency. This vaccine could be ready as early as November pending approval from American health authorities.

Also in the news, the president of the Conference of Bishops of France will be summoned by Gérald Darmanin at the beginning of next week. The Minister of the Interior calls for explanations after his controversial statement. Monseigneur de Moulins-Beaufort declared that the secrecy of the confession was "stronger than the laws of the Republic". This statement came the day after the publication of the Sauvé report on child crime within the Catholic Church.

And the doors of the Vélodrome stadium have just opened and thousands of residents of Marseilles are preparing to pay tribute to Bernard Tapie, who died a few days ago. The coffin of the businessman will be exposed in a gallery before his funeral scheduled for tomorrow in Marseille.

And then a word of soccer to finish: Belgium has not digested its defeat against *Les Bleus* in the semi-final of the 2018 World Cup. The red devils want their revenge tonight in Turin. The Semi-final of the Nations' League France-Belgium begins tonight at 8:45 p.m.
