Marseille will be paying its final respects to Bernard Tapie today. The life of the businessman who died on October 3 will be celebrated in the late morning in the cathedral Sainte-Marie-Majeure. Bernard Tapie will be buried in the cemetery of Mazargues, in the south of Marseille.

The conseil scientifique has advised the phasing out of the health pass between mid-November and the end of the year. The pass will remain in place until at least mid November. The announcement came yesterday from government spokesperson Gabriel Attal.

And finally, who will be this year's Nobel Peace Prize winner? The announcement will come today from Oslo. 329 candidates are in the running. Among the favourites is Gretha Thunberg, the 18 year old climate activist from Sweden, along with several organizations that defend press freedom.
