A page in the history of France has turned. The last companion of the liberation Hubert Germain passed away this week at the age of 101 years old. A national tribute was paid at the Invalides this afternoon. Emmanuel Macrons stated the following: "With his brothers in arms, he had defended freedom. The life of Hubert Germain is an anthology of commitment and courage".

The High Authority of Health advises against the Moderna vaccine for the booster doses. It evokes a risk of pericarditis and myocarditis which may be more important. It temporarily recommends no longer using Moderna but only Pfizer.

For its part, the White House announces the end of entry restrictions for vaccinated people. Foreigners will be able to travel to the United States again from November 8. Two phases will be put in place, a first with a compulsory vaccine only for "non-essential" trips, then a second "early January" 2022 with compulsory vaccination for all travelers.

Also in the news: It was almost a year ago to the day. Students and their teachers paid tribute this Friday to Samuel Paty. Various tributes took place, teachers had the choice of organizing a minute of silence, organizing debates or screening documentaries.

And a tory MP was stabbed to death in the UK. He received several stab wounds on Friday in Essex. A suspect has been arrested.

And it is a decisive step towards the formation of a new government in Germany: The Social Democrats who came first in the legislative elections, the Liberals and the Greens announce that they have reached a preliminary agreement to form a coalition. "It is a very good result, it clearly shows that a government can be formed in Germany" says the Social Democrat Olaf Scholz, probable future chancellor.
