The sanitary pass might be enforced for a long time to come. In any case, the possibility of it ending on November 15, as originally planned, seems less and less conceivable. The government spokesman Gabriel Attal admits he does not see how we could do without the pass, as there is a resumption of the epidemic. The government is also considering making the booster dose mandatory to keep a valid sanitary pass.

Meanwhile, 5 to 11 year-olds might be able to get vaccinated as early as next month in the United States with the Pfizer vaccine. The White House says it is ready, once the authorization is given by health authorities. 28 million American children are eligible.

"I have always responded to court summons". Nicolas Sarkozy reacts after the Paris court ordered his hearing in the Elysee polls case as a witness. The former president claims to have always respected his obligations, and says he has nothing to hide.

The case of Mathieu Valbuena's sex-tape is being presented in court. The trial opened this morning in Versailles, in the presence of the former player of the French team. On the other hand, Karim Benzema, tried for complicity in attempted blackmail, was not present. The striker of Real Madrid faces five years in prison.

A new organization has been dissolved by the Ministry of the Interior. Gérald Darmanin says that The "Coordination against racism and Islamophobia" calls for hatred, violence and discrimination. The decree of dissolution specifies that the association instrumentalizes events in order to provoke violent reactions.

And then 9 departments of the north-west are under orange weather alert for violent winds. Côtes d'Armor, Calvados, Seine-Maritime, Eure, Oise and Somme join the Finistère, Morbihan and Manche. Gusts reaching up to 130 km/h are expected on the coast.
