The past 3 days have seen 5,000 daily patients infected with Covid-19. Coronavirus cases are increasing in France, while on October 19th we were at 4,700 daily contaminations. Despite this increase in numbers, the number of patients remains stable in hospitals. According to the Directorate General of Health, more than 73% of French people are now double vaccinated.

A new vaccine is available for booster shots. The European Medicines Agency approved it yesterday, for adults. The High Authority for Health should issue an opinion to validate this European decision in the coming days.

No more traditional hunting. The eight government decrees authorizing these practices have been suspended. This comes as a consequence of the seizure of the judge of summary proceedings of the Council of State by associations for the defense of animals. In a press release, the institution declared that the Council of State will rule on the merits of the appeals against its decrees in the coming months.

"Shots intended to kill": the words of Grégory Doucet, mayor of Lyon, after shots were fired at police yesterday evening in the district of Duchère. The police carried out a patrol around the area of a drug deal, with a security perimeter. There were no injuries. An investigation for attempted homicide has been opened.

A new place of memory and history. The Dreyfus Affair Museum opens its doors today. For the occasion, Emmanuel Macron will go to Yvelines in Médan to inaugurate it. Installed in the villa of Emile Zola, defender himself of Alfred Dreyfus. No less than 500 documents will be on display to keep the memory of this affair alive.
