The independent commission on incest and sexual violence against children issued an opinion on Wednesday. Among the recommendations to fight against this, the suspension of parental authorities and visitation rights in the event of rape or incestuous sexual assault against a child has been proposed.

Thirty-nine percent of French people have not returned to cultural places since the establishment of the health pass according to a survey requested by the government. Before the pandemic, 89% went to the theaters or cinemas. The survey, which was carried out by Harris Interactive, will be unveiled by Roselyne Bachelot, the Minister of Culture today.

In parallel, coronavirus cases are on the rise across France. More than 6,600 new cases have been identified in the country in the last 24 hours, or 11% more than seven days ago. Forty-five departments are now above the alert threshold of 50 cases per 100,000 inhabitants. In terms of hospitalizations, the figures still remain stable, with 1000 people in critical care.

In Sicily, the severe bad weather of recent hours has left two dead and one missing. Torrential rains caused flooding in the streets of Catania. The authorities are advising residents not to leave their homes while the cyclonic storm passes.
