Two new measures on unemployment reform will come into force on December 1st. The Minister of Labour Elisabeth Borne has made the announcement today. These are the degression of rights and an increase in the minimum number of months worked required in order to receive benefits.

Senators will be discussing the bill to extend the enforcement of the health pass today. The pass could be required to gain entry to certain places until the end of July 2022. With the current right-wing majority in the Senate, a clause to review the situation could be added.

Seven police officers will come before a disciplinary council today. They have been summoned by the head of the Police National after the murder of Chahinez Boutaa. Ms Boutaa was killed by her husband in the Mérignac. After her death, a report uncovered several blunders in the lead up to the murder, including a complaint from Ms Boutaa that was badly handled.

Rémy Dailly will be prosecuted for criminal conspiracy, after the newspaper Le Parisien uncovered a secret plan known as "Operation Azur", which amounted to a coup d'état. Dailly is currently held in provisional detention. His lawyer says he denies any terrorist plans.

And finally, there's a new name in store for the Zuckerberg conglomerate that owns the social media giants, Facebook, Instagram and WhatsApp. Mark Zuckerberg is due to unveil the new name himself today at the Connect conference.
