Emmanuel Macron is inflexible on the issue of fishing licenses. Yesterday on the sidelines of the G20, the French president met with his British counterpart, Boris Johnson. He again demanded more authorization for French fishermen to venture into English territorial waters. "The ball is in the court of the British" said the head of state, recalling that if no agreement was reached by Tuesday, France will prohibit British ships from unloading their cargo in the ports of France.

After the G20, The COP 26. Officially launched yesterday in Glasgow, today it gets to the heart of the matter. The heads of state of some 200 countries represented must speak. Emmanuelle Macron should speak around 3 pm this afternoon.

On the Covid-19 front. Resurgence of the epidemic continues to be confirmed. According to data released this Sunday evening by Public Health France, the number of cases recorded has increased by 11% over one week. 6,572 people are currently hospitalized. Among them, 1,046 were admitted to critical care.
