Didier Raoult will have to explain himself. The infectious disease specialist who spoke during the health crisis is summoned today before the Regional Council of the Order of Physicians of New Aquitaine. The procedure against him was initiated more than a year ago. He is accused of not having respected ethics, in particular for having questioned the effectiveness of wearing a mask and for having promoted hydroxychloroquine.

The final parliamentary steps for the 'health vigilance' bill. This text, which provides for the use of the health pass to be extended until July 31st, was immediately rejected by the senators yesterday. They demanded a less extended version, until the end of February.

The United States announced yesterday that they would offer 10 million dollars for any information allowing them to find the members of DarkSide. This group of hackers is known to develop ransomware. In Washington, this Russian-based group is behind the attack that targeted a large pipeline network on American soil last May.
