Relief in Mayenne: After more than 24 hours of searching, the 17-year-old jogger was found alive. She had disappeared Monday afternoon after leaving for a run. The teenager was discovered in shock and covered in blood about 10 km from the place of her disappearance. She must now undergo medical examinations before speaking with the gendarmes. The investigation is continuing to determine what happened.

The wearing of a mask will finally be compulsory in all schools from Monday. The obligation is extended throughout the country, while it concerns only 61 departments for the moment. This comes as a result of the resurgence of the coronavirus epidemic.

And faced with the risk of a fifth wave, Emmanuel Macron addressed the country last night. The Head of State announced that from December 15th, those over 65 years will have to receive a third booster dose to be able to keep their health pass. This third dose will be extended to 50-64 year olds. The booster campaign will be launched at the beginning of December.

Other announcements from the president: France will build new nuclear power plants by 2030. The objective will be to maintain energy independence. On the issue of the pension reform, Macron said "the conditions are not met for the moment to relaunch the reform".

François Hollande is expected today at the Special Assize Court in Paris. The former President of the Republic will speak at the trial of the attacks of November 13th, 2015, where he was cited as a witness by an association of victims. His hearing is scheduled to begin at 12:30 pm, in a highly secure courthouse.

And in an extraordinary challenge, Théo Curin, the French swimmer who has all four limbs amputated, will cross Lake Titicaca. The crossing is 122 km between Bolivia and Peru and should last 10 days.
