"I owe it to all the victims" are the first words of François Hollande before the Circuit Court of Paris as he was heard as a witness at the trial of the attacks of November 13, 2015. The former President also spoke of that night of horror: The first detonation heard near the Stade de France during the France-Germany match, then the second... "At that point I no longer had doubts" he said. Subsequently evoking the decisions he had to make in the minutes that followed, such as how to go about having the hostages released from the Bataclan and potentially closing the borders to avoid the flight of the terrorists.

Gabriel Attal states that "The deterioration of the epidemic situation in France is clear". The government spokesman spoke this afternoon at the end of the Council of Ministers. He clarified the announcements of Emmanuel Macron last night, in particular the obligation of a 3rd dose from December 15 for people over 65 who received their 2nd dose 6 months ago. This will now be the only condition for a valid Sanitary Pass.

Meanwhile in the United States, children are getting vaccinated, a week after the green light was given by local health authorities. 900,000 children aged 5 to 11 have already received a first dose of vaccine across the Atlantic. The announcement was made this evening by the White House.

All metropolitan regions are now affected by bronchiolitis. The latest, Corsica, has just entered the epidemic phase. Throughout France, 4000 children under 2 were examined last week by emergency services and 1400 were hospitalized as a result of this virus.

And then in Tennis, the 21-year-old Hugo Gaston was called for the French Davis Cup. He replaces Ugo Humbert who is injured and forfeits the final phase of the event which begins at the end November. This is a nice reward for the Toulousain, recent quarter-finalist at the Masters 1000 of Paris Bercy and now in the TOP 100 of the ATP ranking.
