She will be heard by investigators today. Lisa, the missing 17-year-old jogger who was found on Tuesday at Sablé sur Sarthe, will answer questions about her schedule. The objective is to establish a clear course of events. The story is still not totally clear. Lisa disappeared for more than 24 hours before being found in a fast food restaurant. For now, the abduction hypothesis still stands.

Soaring covid cases in many European countries, including France. The incidence rate in France is up by 44% in one week. Corsica, Pays de la Loire, and Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur are the most affected regions. In related news, the European Medicines Agency has approved the use of two new antibody treatments. They will be available on the market soon.

France's final tribute to Hubert Germain, the last living member of la libération was buried yesterday in the crypt of the war memorial at Mont-Valérien. Such were the wishes of General de Gaulle and Hubert Germain himself.

Abroad, Belarus President Alexandre Loucachenko has announced that he can cut off the gas supply to the continent in the event of new sanctions. The country is suspected of fueling a migration crisis on its border with Poland. According to the UN Security Council meeting yesterday, it is "orchestrated instrumentalisation of human beings".

The independence referendum in New Caledonia will take place on December 12th. The High Commissioner of the Republic visiting the Archipelago announced it today.

And finally, the Queen of England is feeling better. Queen Elizabeth will make her first official outing after weeks of rest. She will go to the Cenotaph in London on Sunday to pay tribute to the victims of the First World War.
