4 days after the knife attack against police officers in Cannes, the national anti-terrorist prosecution announces that it will not take up this case. A judicial investigation has been opened for assassination attempt on police officials. The suspect, a 37-year-old Algerian national, is still hospitalized following retaliatory fire during his arrest. He will be heard when his state of health allows so.

A hearing to find out the truth: Lisa is being heard once again today by investigators. The 1st statements of the 17-year-old jogger found Tuesday in Mayenne after having disappeared for 24 hours seem to show inconsistencies. She had claimed to have been kidnapped by several kidnappers, also evoking the presence of a green van, but nothing so far seems to confirm this scenario.

This is a historic day celebrated by the Abbé Pierre Foundation. EDF announced this morning that it will no longer cut off electricity in the event of unpaid bills throughout the year - even after March 31. Instead, the company will reduce the power supplied to its customers. The objective being to guarantee a minimum service to use essential appliances such as refrigerators.

Gas deliveries to Europe will continue. Moscow is taking a stand in the conflict between the European Union and Belarus which threatens to cut off the arrival of gas for the continent. The country is accused by Brussels of fueling a migration crisis on its border with Poland by granting visas to people from the Middle East. A response from the Belarusian President Alexandre Loukachenko to European sanctions decided against his government for its repression of the opposition.

And then the final stretch at the COP 26 in Glasgow: The climate summit ends tonight. All participants must agree to a final declaration, but discussions are difficult and may continue this weekend.
