The Toulouse Court of Appeal is examining today the new request for release of Cédric Jubillar, suspected of having killed his wife Delphine, last December in Cagnac-les-Mines. The body of the nurse has never been found. This is the 3rd time that Cédric Jubillar tries to obtain his release as he remains in pre-trial detention. A solemn march in memory by Delphine was organized yesterday by her family.

In the trial of Mireille Knoll the 80-year-old Jewish woman killed in Paris in 2018, Yacine Mihoub, was sentenced last week to life in prison. As decided by the court, the murder is a hate crime and there will therefore not be second trial.

In the rest of the news, the risk of a 5th epidemic wave is confirmed. For the first time since September 11, the incidence rate in France has risen above 100 cases per 100,000 inhabitants - a figure which has almost doubled in just 2 weeks.

There are strikes today in the airports of Paris-Charles de Gaulle, Orly but also in Nice. Security personnel demand an increase in wages and an improvement in working conditions. Delays are therefore expected for security checks.

Today is the last day to join *les Republicans*. Supporters have until midnight to vote at the party 's convention. Members will choose their LR candidate for the presidential election on December 4.
