"This case has nothing, evidence was fabricated" says Alexandre Martin, the lawyer of Cédric Jubillar. His client, indicted for the murder of his wife Delphine who has been missing for nearly one year, was heard today before the Toulouse Court of Appeal. After two hours of hearing behind closed doors, the Attorney General requested that Cédric Jubillar remain in prison. The judgment will be delivered on November 22.

Emmanuel Macron announces an additional loan of nearly 2 billion euros for the hydrogen sector. This loan is added to the plan of seven billion euros already in place to help the sector. The government wants to make France one of the European leaders in hydrogen manufacturing, with the aim of reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

Vaccination against the coronavirus has greatly reduced hospitalizations of the most vulnerable. This is what emerges from the data published by Santé Public France. During the fourth wave, the average number of cases and deaths were reduced by more than 90% for residents in nursing homes, compared to the second wave.

Abroad, the epidemic resumes in Germany and the city of Munich cancels its Christmas market - An event that attracts more than two million visitors each year. The mayor justifies the cancellation by the exponential increase of infections.

On Twitter the Minister of Armed Forces speaks of "space raiders" to evoke the destruction of a satellite by Russia. A satellite whose debris could have threatened the integrity of the international space station. Florence Parly denounces debris which pollutes and puts astronauts and satellites in danger.

And then in soccer, *les Bleus* are back on the field tonight. The French team travels to Finland for the last qualifying match of the World Cup in Qatar. The French, already qualified, will therefore play without pressure. Kick-off 8:45 pm.
