Emmanuel Macron paid tribute to the mayors of France at the end of the. The Head of State praised the work of these elected officials. Mayors are often at the heart of crises, according to Emmanuel Macron, who cites weather phenomena, attacks, or even social movements. "Each time, the mayors were at the forefront", said the president. He delivered his speech after that of the new president of the mayors of France: the Cannois David Lisnard.

The Parliament adopts the law for "confidence in justice" presented by the Minister of Justice Eric Dupond-Moretti. The text provides for the possibility of filming trials and the professional secrecy of lawyers will be supervised in matters of terrorism, tax fraud and corruption.

Another text is adopted by Parliament, that is the bill against animal abuse. The law enacts the progressive prohibition of wild animals in circuses and dolphinariums, the sale of puppies and kittens in pet shops is prohibited and penalties for abuse or abandonment are strengthened.

While the epidemic resumption is confirmed in France, the government does not plan to call for a massive recourse to remote work. At least not for the moment. The Ministry of Labor says that the situation is not the same as last spring, with 90% of adults vaccinated today. However, the Minister Elisabeth Borne regrets a relaxation of barrier gestures in the workplace, especially concerning masks.
