Domestic violence has increased by 10% last year according to the Ministry of the Interior. About 87% of victims are women. In addition, 125 people were killed by their partner, the vast majority of which are women. 102 of them were killed by their spouse or their ex.

The professional soccer league is meeting urgently today following the incident that occurred during the match between Lyon and Marseille last night. Since the beginning of the season the number of incidents in the stands have increased in Premier league.

After Guadeloupe, Martinique is on a general strike from today. They demand the end of the obligation to get vaccinated for caregivers, but also for a rise in wages and social minima. On social networks, several messages evoke blockades on the roads. As a result, many residents have rushed to supermarkets and gas stations.

Cédric Jubillar will learn his fate today. The Toulouse Court of Appeal will render its decision concerning his request for release. Cédric Jubillar is indicted for the murder of his wife Delphine who has disappeared nearly a year ago. The only suspect will be heard on December 3.

In the United States, a suspect has been identified after the tragedy that occurred in Wisconsin where a car drove into a crowd during a Christmas parade. Five people have died and forty are injured. The circumstances of the tragedy are still unclear, as we do not know the motivations of the driver. Schools in the area will not open today and some roads will remain closed for the duration of the investigation.

And then the skippers of the Jacques Vabre transatlantic are getting closer to the finish line. The first boats will arrive in Martinique tomorrow night, in Fort-de-France. And it is the Sébastien Rogue - Matthieu Soubène duo, which is expected arrive first in the "Ocean fifty" category. Their boat was 55 miles ahead of that of Erwan Le Roux and Xavier Macaire this morning.
