A new twist in the case of the disappearance of Delphine Jubillar. The current companion of the victim, Cédric Jubillar, was arrested and taken into custody this morning. This arrest comes a year after the disappearance of the 33-year-old nurse in Cagnac les mines in le Tarn.

A week after the collapse of a building in Sanary-sur-Mer in the Var. A judicial investigation will be opened today for manslaughter and unintentional injuries. A possible suicide is being considered by the investigators. A resident of the building was left alone in his home with the presence of gas.

In the rest of the news, concern around the Omicron variant. This strain of the coronavirus is expected to be dominant in Europe from January. This announcement came this morning from the President of the European Commission, Ursula von der Leyen. The Netherlands have taken the lead, with closure of primary schools from December 20th, one week before the start of the Christmas holidays.

In France, vaccination still remains the best defense against the epidemic. From today, 5-11 year olds suffering from comorbidities can now receive an injection. This is the first step before the probable generalization of vaccination to all children before the end of the year.

From today, the health pass will be deactivated for nearly 400,000 French people who have not received their booster dose in time. The 65 and over, who have had no injection for 7 months will therefore be denied access to restaurants, cafes, and theaters.

Emmanuel Macron will speak to the French people this evening at 9 pm in an interview that will serve as an update on the five-year term, particularly in his management of the health crisis.

Magistrates, lawyers, and clerks call for a strike to denounce the lack of pay and working conditions. Gatherings are planned in front of the courts, all over France. In Paris, a demonstration is scheduled for noon in front of the Ministry of the Economy and Finance.
