After her candidacy in 2002, Christiane Taubira is again candidate for the presidency. The former Minister of Justice formalized her candidacy this morning in a video posted on social networks.

And in a few moments Anne Hidalgo will speak to discuss her proposal for the primary on the left - A primary in which Christiane Taubira might participate.

The National Ethics Committee approves extending the vaccination campaign to all children aged 5 to 11 - But only on a voluntary basis.
