A red weather alert has been issued for 5 departments of the South-West: Pyrénées-Atlantiques, Hautes-Pyrénées, Haute-Garonne, Ariège and Landes for rain and floods. In Oloron Sainte-Marie, in the Pyrénées-Atlantiques, the *gaves* are being closely monitored as the water is dangerously rising.

4 other departments are under orange alert: Aisne, Tarn et Garonne and Gers for risks of flooding and the Eastern Pyrenees for avalanches.

The bad weather had strongly affected the Roya valley in the Maritime Alps 1 year ago. Emmanuel Macron is expected on site this afternoon to take stock of the reconstruction. The Head of State is this morning in Nice to discuss security issues.

Also in the news, Stéphane Claireaux will file a complaint. The LREM deputy of Saint-Pierre et Miquelon was attacked yesterday in front of his home on the sidelines of a demonstration against the sanitary pass. The elected official received several projectiles as stones were thrown at him.

And then the soap opera continues: Novak Djokovic will know his fate tomorrow while the Australian court ordered his release this morning. However, the government can still decide to expel the Serbian tennis player. The Minister of Immigration Alex Hawke did not use his personal power to cancel his visa. He will make his decision tomorrow. In the meantime, Novak Djokovic is free. He was able to leave the hotel where he was being held since last Thursday.
