The details of a simplified health protocol in schools were given last night by Jean Castex. Previously, contact case students had to perform three tests including a PCR or antigen. From now on, three self-tests will be enough.

Another government weapon to fight against the epidemic: The vaccine pass. After an eventful adoption last week in the Assemblée Nationale, the bill will be examined this afternoon in the Senate. If adopted, the Vaccine Pass will be necessary to justify a complete vaccination status to access certain activities. A negative test will no longer suffice. The executive hopes that this measure will be adopted for next week.

The anger of health and social action professionals. At the call of several unions, including CGT health, they are called to mobilize today across France. They ask for the recruitment of more staff, the opening of beds, and an increase in salaries.

And in the case of the disappearance of Delphine Jubillar, the courts will today examine a new request for the release of the husband, Cédric Jubillar, the main suspect in this case. He is accused of the murder of the nurse, who has been missing for more than a year in Cagnac-les-Mines in Le Tarn. According to Le Parisien, the magistrates have requested two new tests on Cédric Jubillar's phone and the duvet washed the night of the disappearance.

In a giant leap for science and medicine, American surgeons have succeeded in transplanting a heart from a genetically modified pig into a human patient. The operation, carried out on Friday, made it possible to show for the first time that an animal heart could continue to function inside a human without immediate rejection.
