Four years after the Millas bus accident, which killed six schoolchildren, the driver is sent back to the correctional court. "There is no doubt that the driver's inattention and recklessness are the direct cause of the accident", according to the magistrates. The bus had struck a TER while the level crossing barrier was probably closed, contrary to what the driver said. A hearing is scheduled for the end of April at the court of Marseille.

Within one week, three different protocols have been implemented in schools. The rules are changing once again, after criticism received by the government from parents and teachers. Now, after a contamination, each student in the class will have to perform three self-tests a few days apart. The self-tests will be free, thanks to a certificate issued by the school.

There will be no additional increase in the price of electricity in 2022, as promised by Barbara Pompili. The Minister of Ecological Transition reiterates the government's promise to limit the increase to 4%. Additional measures will be put in place to avoid postponing the price increase to 2023.

A second man is in custody in Seine-Saint-Denis, after the broadcast of a video showing the passengers of a car dragging pedestrians forcing them to run alongside the car. The suspect turned himself in at the police station of Noisy-le-Sec this morning. He says he is the author of the video and published it on social networks. A third suspect is still wanted.

It's official, France will organize the Rugby Union World Cup in 2025. 158 matches will be planned in forty cities. "It's a great moment" Jean Castex said earlier in front of the press to launch the event.

And then 8 departments of the south-west are still under orange weather alert for floods: From the Gironde to the Haute-Garonne via the Gers. The current weather conditions has caused several schools to close down and disturbances in the public transportation.
