Eric Zemmour will appeal his conviction after being fined 10,000 euros for incitement to hatred. The Paris Criminal Court gave its verdict today concerning the statements that the presidential candidate had made in September 2020 on Cnews. He had described unaccompanied minor migrants as thieves, murderers and rapists. In this case, around thirty non-profits have joined as civil parties, including SOS Racisme and around twenty departmental councils in charge of child welfare.

Eric Zemmour is also targeted by the National Advisory Council for People with Disabilities. Today the organization strongly condemned the comments made by the polemicist at the end of last week. Eric Zemmour had then said that he wanted to educate children with disabilities in specialized establishments and put an end to this, I quote, "obsession with inclusion".

There's a new twist in the investigation into the disappearance of Delphine Jubillar. Excavations began today in Cagnac les mines in the Tarn and will last several days. Searches are carried out around a farm located near the couple's home. Cédric Jubillar, who is the main suspect in this case, continues to claim his innocence.

The trials of the attacks of November 13, 2015 are suspended again for several days. The hearing will not resume before January 25 at the earliest. One of the defendants has tested positive for covid.

Wearing a mask becomes mandatory again in certain outdoor places in Paris. A new decree was issued today by the prefect of police. The decree mainly targets the busiest places such as markets, bus stops, school surroundings and shopping center entrances. Outdoor gatherings of more than 10 people are also prohibited.

And then handball tonight with the continuation of the men's Euro. Tonight is the last match of the preliminary round for the French team which faces Serbia. *Les Bleus*, who won their first two matches, will try to earn valuable points for the rest of the competition in Hungary. The match begins at 8:30 p.m.
