Jean-Michel Blanquer admits that he made a mistake with his choice of vacation time. The Minister of Education is being criticized for going to Ibiza on vacation while the teachers were in the dark concerning the sanitary protocol. He regrets the symbolism of his vacation site but assures that he continued to work and that his decisions would not have been any different if he had gone elsewhere.

The Constitutional Council will make its decision on the vaccination pass on Friday. After being contested by parliamentarians of the opposition, the text was adopted on Sunday after two weeks of heated debates. In the event of a green light, the entry into force of the new system will be effective immediately.

She is known for her anti-abortion positions. The Secretary of State for European Affairs, Clément Beaune, says he is embarrassed by the symbol of this election.
