Less than 2% of teachers are on strike today according to the Ministry of Education. They were 31% last Thursday. However, their grievances remain unchanged, namely too many changes concerning the sanitary protocol put in place in schools. Demonstrations are planned throughout France. In Paris, protestors will leave from place de la Sorbonne at 2 p.m.

When will nightclubs reopen and when will stadiums and concerts be allowed without capacity limitations? The question was at the heart of discussions during this morning's new health defense council. It seems like these measures will not be immediately lifted. The government is, however, considering extending the rule of 3 days minimum of remote work per week.

Also in the news, a special cell was set up in the Champagnole high school in the Jura. This is where the 4 victims of a yesterday's road accident were going to school. According to the Jura prosecutor, the driver lost control of his vehicle on a very icy road, before ending his trajectory in a lake. A 5th passenger was able to get out of the car in time and alert emergency services.

Eric Zemmour is back in court. He was sentenced at the beginning of the week to a fine of 10,000 euros for incitement to hatred. The presidential candidate is tried this time for contesting a crime against humanity. At the end of 2019 on CNews, he had claimed that Marshal Pétain had saved French Jews during the Second World War.

And nearly 2.5 million poultry will be slaughtered in the coming weeks in the Southwest because of the avian flu. The announcement was made by the Ministry of Agriculture. 216 outbreaks have been detected so far.

And to finish: will France organize the 2034 or 2038 Winter Olympics? In any case, it is Renaud Muselier's wish. The president of the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur region wishes to carry the candidacy of the Southern Alps. He announced this this morning during a press conference.
