From Belfort, Emmanuel Macron announced the construction of 6 new EPRs - eight other new generation nuclear reactors may also be launched before 2050. At the same time, the Head of State wishes to massively develop renewable energies within the next 30 years, in particular with the installation of 50 wind farms at sea. The objective is that France become the first major country to no longer be dependent on fossil fuels.

There may be something new in the investigation into the disappearance of Delphine Jubillar. Traces of blood were found inside the car of an acquaintance of the husband. For now, however, it is impossible to say whether these are traces of animal or human blood. Analyzes are underway; the results will be known before the end of March. In the meantime, Cédric Jubillar will be heard again tomorrow by the judges in charge of the case.

The *Convoi de la Liberté* is prohibited in Paris. Those who are opposed to the health restriction still plan to block the capital this weekend, but measures will be put in place to prevent them from doing so. The gathering will then travel to Brussels for a large demonstration on Monday. The demonstration has also been prohibited by Belgian authorities.

Tomorrow we will know the new health protocol in schools. The Minister of Education Jean Michel Blanquer must announce a series of adjustments such as the end of masks during recess or a change in the screening policy. These new measures are still being discussed and could be implemented as of February 21.

In the United Kingdom, Prince Charles once again tests positive for Covid. All his trips have been canceled. Already affected by the virus in March 2020, the son of Queen Elizabeth II is now self-isolating.
