More than 400 civilians have been killed since the beginning of the Russian invasion in Ukraine, according to the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights. 800 people have also been injured. According to the UN these figures are probably an underestimate.

Meanwhile, the third round of negotiations between Russia and Ukraine is currently taking place in Belarus as bombings continue in major Ukrainian cities. According to the mayor of Kyiv, violent combat is taking place at the northwest of the capital. In an interview with LCI, Emmanuel Macron denounced the "moral and political cynicism" of Vladimir Putin, as Moscow offers humanitarian corridors to Ukrainians only to bring them to Russia. The offer was rejected by Ukraine.

As a result of the conflict, the price of European gas continues to increase and now exceeds 300 euros per megawatt hour, which is a historic record. To deal with this, the Minister of Economy Bruno Le Maire plans to devote more than 20 billion euros to support measures for purchasing power.

The French will have the choice between twelve candidates for the presidential election. The list was unveiled at midday by the President of the Constitutional Council, Laurent Fabius. The First round will take place in a little over a month, on April 10th.

And in this race for the Elysée, Emmanuel Macron is organizing his first trip today as a candidate. He will be in the Yvelines at the end of the afternoon, in Poissy to talk with people about topics of their choice.

On the eve of Women's Rights Day, six out of ten French women say they have been subjected to a sexist act or remarks in the street and in public transportation, according to the High Council for Gender Equality. In addition, nearly one in two women has experienced sexist acts at work.

And to finish: two new gold medals for France this morning at the Paralympic Games in Beijing.
