Russia is committed to new ceasefires for the evacuation of civilians. Humanitarian corridors are currently being set up in Kiev, Sumy, Kharkiv, Chernihiv, and Mariupol, which have been besieged by Russian troops for several days.

And on the front, the conflict continues. Despite the strikes, Kiev seems to be resisting for the moment. In the surroundings, in Makariv, a town located near the capital, at least 13 people were killed yesterday in the bombardment of an industrial bakery. This weekend, a 2nd nuclear center was attacked in Kharkiv, but without consequences according to a United Nations organization.

At the same time, negotiations are continuing to try to curb Russia's invasion of Ukraine. At the end of a 3rd round of talks between Kyiv and Moscow yesterday, Ukraine spoke about "positive results" regarding the humanitarian corridors. Russia, on the other hand, considers that the "negotiations did not live up to expectations".

In the rest of the news, Emmanuel Macron, was for the first time, in the electoral campaign yesterday in the Yvelines. The President of the Republic and candidate for his own re-election spoke with the inhabitants of Poissy and detailed the main lines of his program. In particular, he wants to abolish the TV license fee, triple the Macron bonus, and put in place an aid measure in the face of rising fuel prices. Emmanuel Macron has also announced that he will not participate in any debate with the other candidates before the first round.

Today is March 8th, International Women's Day. Across France, gender equality rallies are planned. In Paris, the procession will leave at 2 pm from Gare du Nord.
