Today is the 14th day of conflict between Ukraine and Russia. The two countries have agreed on a ceasefire to allow the establishment of humanitarian corridors for the evacuation of civilians. The bombings continue. The Russian army is accused of having bombed a children's clinic in Mariupol in the south-east of the country. "A war crime", according to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky.

At the same time, the Chernobyl nuclear power plant is targeted by Russian operations. The site is completely cut off from the electricity network. According to the International Atomic Energy Agency, this does not present a major impact on safety. As a reminder, the 1986 Chernobyl nuclear disaster was the most serious in history.

The situation in Ukraine is also on the program of the European summit in Versailles. The 27 EU member countries will meet for two days. There are several questions on the table, in particular the redefinition of the economic model for the European Union, its energy and food independence from Russia.

Also in the news, demonstrations in Corsica. Several hundred people mobilized yesterday in Bastia as well as in other cities of the Island to support Yvan Colonna, the separatist attacked in prison ten days ago. At least 23 CRS officers and civilians were injured, including a journalist, and a fire was started

In tennis, Novak Djokovic has been forced to forfeit the American tour. The Serbian man is banned from entering the United States to play the two tournaments in Miami and Indian Wells. This is what he announced on Twitter last night. In question is his vaccination situation.
