Emmanuel Macron calls for calm and responsibility in Corsica after the death of Yvan Colonna. Sentenced to life imprisonment for the murder of prefect Erignac, the independence activist died yesterday of his injuries after being attacked by a radicalized prisoner in the prison of Arles. "Lessons will be learned. We cannot let things like this happen in our prisons", said Emmanuel Macron. The first conclusions of the administrative investigation will be made public in early April.

The blockade of the oil depots of Lorient and Brest has ended. In Finistère, tank trucks can once again access the site. The demonstrators left this morning, a week after the beginning of their mobilization to denounce the rise in fuel prices. The Prefecture promises to deal with their demands. Transporters, public works professionals, farmers and fishermen are now hoping for new government measures to limit prices at the pump, which is a direct consequence of the war in Ukraine.

On the 27th day of the conflict, Volodymyr Zelensky raises his voice. The Ukrainian president has called on Europe to impose more sanctions on Moscow. "Close your ports to Russian boats and block the assets of the oligarchs", said the leader during a videoconference speech before the Italian Parliament.

In China, concern is growing 24 hours after the crash of a plane in the southwest of the country. So far, no survivors have been found. There were 132 people on board the aircraft which crashed for reasons still unknown. The search continues.

And in tennis: a hard blow for Rafael Nadal: The Spaniard will be absent from the courts for 4 to 6 weeks due to a rib injury. As a consequence, he could miss the Monte-Carlo and Barcelona tournaments, which are two major events of the season.
