Volodymyr Zelensky said today that these war crimes will soon be recognized as genocide, as the President of Ukraine visited Boutcha, a town near kyiv in which hundreds of corpses of civilians were found in the streets. The city has now been taken over by Ukrainian forces. The international community has unanimously condemned these actions and is now trying to react. The European Union has urgently begun discussions to take new sanctions against Moscow.

And concern is also growing in Mariupol - The Ukrainian city is now 90% destroyed. There are still more than 100,000 people on site. It is not possible for now to evacuate these people because the Russian bombings continue to intensify according to humanitarian organizations.

In France, the question of autonomy for Corsica will wait. The meeting scheduled for Friday between Gérald Darmanin and the Corsican nationalists is canceled by the Minister of the Interior; and this after the violence committed yesterday in Ajaccio. The demonstration was in tribute to Yvan Colonna but ended up with 27 people injured, including 12 among police forces.

The trial behind closed doors opened today before the Children's Court of Pontoise: That of two middle school students. They are on trial for murder after the death of their classmate a year ago in Argenteuil. Alisha, 14 years old, had drowned in the Seine in March of 2021. The two defendants, a boy and a girl aged 15 at the time, are accused of having trapped the victim before striking her and pushing her into the water. They risk up to 20 years in prison.

A long-awaited report will be made available this evening - That of the IPCC. The UN climate experts will deliver the third part of their conclusions on global warming. The text is intended to present solutions to try to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

And then it's one of the consequences of Covid: Easyjet canceled more than 200 flights this weekend. Dozens of departures may also be canceled before tomorrow. This is due to the wave of covid that is currently affecting many employees of the British company.
