The Ukrainian president has denounced "war crimes" in Boutcha in the Kyiv region, where hundreds of civilians, sometimes tortured, have been found dead after the passage of Russian troops. Volodymyr Zelensky calls on the international community to recognize a genocide. He will address the UN Security Council today.

In France, what really happened to Jérémy Cohen? The 31-year-old man died after being hit by a tram on February 16th in Bobigny, in Seine-St-Denis. While the investigation concluded that this was an accident, a video broadcast on social networks relaunched the case. In the video, we see the young man being hit by a group of people before fleeing onto the tram tracks and being hit. An investigation for intentional violence has been opened.

Nearly 80 complaints have been filed against Orpéa. Families accuse the group of mistreating residents. About thirty establishments are targeted for acts of endangering the lives of others, non-assistance to persons in danger, and also for manslaughter.

A hard blow for the Ferrero group, which is forced to recall some batches of Kinder chocolate products, less than 2 weeks before Easter. Their chocolate eggs made in Belgium, such as Kinder Surprise or Schoko-Bons, are suspected of having a link to cases of salmonella.

Five days before the first round of the presidential election, and France 2 is broadcasting its last issue of the Élysée 2022 program this evening. Five candidates out of 12 will be present, and the six others had passed on March 31st. The only absentee will be Emmanuel Macron, who refuses to debate.

Finally, the President of the Republic had promised the reimbursement of sessions with psychologists, during the Assizes of mental health last September. The measure comes into force today, and concerns all French people from 3 years old.
