Emmanuel Macron speaks of a revolting crime. This morning the Kramatorsk station in eastern Ukraine was attacked, causing at least 50 deaths and hundreds of injured. Two rockets fell on the crowded site as thousands of civilians were waiting to flee the region of Donbass, as it had become the priority target of the Russian army. Moscow denies being behind this attack. The Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky has denounced an evil without limit to evoke the operations carried out by the Kremlin.

And Volodymyr Zelensky will meet today with the President of the European Commission, Ursula Von der Leyen. upon her arrival in kyiev, she firmly condemned the massacre of Kramatorsk. The two leaders will discuss Ukraine's request for integration into the EU – a request that could be submitted as early as this summer. The fate of refugees will also be at the heart of discussions. So far, more than 4 million Ukrainians have fled their country since the beginning of the war.

In the rest of the news, the apologies of the Ferrero group. After the massive recall of Kinder chocolates suspected of being the source of an epidemic of salmonellosis, the agri-food group has indicated that it deeply regrets what happened and it recognizes internal mistakes. The products at the heart of the scandal were all manufactured in the Belgian factory of Arlon. The factory was shut down today by authorities.

This is due to pre-filing errors, according to the tax administration. Investigations are underway to resume accessibility to the site as soon as possible.

We'll end this edition with an extraordinary take-off. At 5:17 p.m., French time, the first private mission in space took off from Cape Canaveral in Florida, heading for the ISS (the International Space Station). Aboard the Space X are 3 businessmen and a former astronaut. The ten-day trip costs about 50 million euros per person.
