No Frexit but a departure from NATO's integrated command. These are the main axes of the foreign policy program unveiled this afternoon by Marine Le Pen. The candidate of the *Rassemblement National* continues her marathon week to try to convince the French. Emmanuel Macron is not traveling today and is concentrating on the media: He was on France 2 this morning where he criticized his opponent's proposal to modify the constitution in order to facilitate referendums. For Emmanuel Macron, Marine Le Pen does not "respect freedoms".

And in between these two rounds, the younger voters want to be heard. Several Parisian universities have been blocked since the publication of the results Monday evening. This is the case of the Ecole Nationale Supérieure and even Paris 8. Students are determined to alert presidential candidates about the challenges of climatic disasters - A movement that could gain momentum. Students from the Sorbonne and Nanterre will meet in general assembly tomorrow.

A week after the revelation of the case surrounding the death of Jérémie Cohen, the Bobigny prosecution indicates that two people have been placed in police custody. They are questioned in connection with the death of this young man hit by a tram after being assaulted by a group of individuals. The question that arises is whether the attack on Jérémie Cohen, a Jew, was motivated by anti-Semitism.

The day after his conviction, Nicolas Zepeda's lawyers announced that he was going to appeal. The young Chilean was sentenced to 28 years in prison by the court of Doubs. He was found guilty of the murder of his former girlfriend in December 2016. Narumi Kurosaki's body was never found.

"A sacred monster has left us", said Emmanuel Macron in his tribute to Michel Bouquet. The actor died at the age of 96. During his 70-year career Michel Bouquet has won numerous awards, including two Caesars and two Molières.
