The UN has announced that more than 5 million people have fled Ukraine since the beginning of the Russian invasion. On the front lines, Moscow has intensified its strikes on kyiev. A missile production workshop has been destroyed near the Ukrainian capital - A new coup by the Kremlin after several setbacks these past days, in particular the loss of a ship that sunk yesterday in the Black Sea.

In France, the campaign for the second round of the presidential election is in full swing. Emmanuel Macron is expected this afternoon at Notre Dame de Paris, but as the President and not as a candidate. 3 years ago, to the day, a terrible fire ravaged the cathedral. Emmanuel Macron is there to take stock of its reconstruction. Emmanuel Macron still wants the monument to reopen in April of 2024.

Meanwhile, Marine Le Pen is in the Vaucluse. This is her 2nd day in the department. After Avignon last night, she is now in Pertuis.

Marine Le Pen denounced a campaign that has nothing to do with republicanism following calls to vote against her in the second round.

Today is a new day of hearing at the trial of the attacks of November 13, 2015. Salah Abdeslam is heard for the second day before the circuit court of Paris - A particularly painful moment for the families of victims. The only survivor of the commando responsible for the attacks indicated earlier that he wanted to be forgotten forever.

2 suspects are imprisoned and indicted in the case of Jérémie Cohen. They are suspected of having beaten the 31-year-old disabled Jewish man. He then died, hit by a tram a few seconds after his attack in Bobigny. According to the prosecutor, so far, nothing points to an antisemitic attack.
