A new name for the presidential majority. *La République en Marche* will be renamed *Renaissance* in view of the legislative elections. The party which has reached an agreement with its allies will present 400 candidates. There will be a hundred for the Modem of François Bayrou and 58 for *Horizons*, the party of Edouard Philippe.

Meanwhile on the left, the debates promise to be very tense. The Socialist Party is having its national council this evening at 7 p.m. It must decide on the agreement concluded with *La France Insoumise* in view of the legislative elections. The alliance is already causing a stir internally. The latest criticism to date is that of Anne Hidalgo. The mayor of Paris denounced the content of the agreement; however, she does not want to prevent it.

There was a robbery in the center of Paris. The armed attack took place this afternoon and targeted a Chanel store in Place Vendôme. Four men fled on a motorbike. We do not know, for now, the amount of loot.

A tragedy occurred on the roads in the Pas de Calais, where 4 people died last night in an accident. A woman in her sixties turned around at a toll before taking the motorway in the opposite direction. She then violently hit a vehicle head-on and did not survive. The three occupants of the other vehicle also died.

France will give an additional 300 million dollars to Ukraine. The total amount of aid from Paris for Kiev now reaches 2 billion dollars. Emmanuel Macron announced this today in a video broadcast during the international donors' conference.

On the front, the ceasefire decreed in Mariupol by Russia is supposedly not respected, according to Ukrainian fighters. They are still dozens mobilized to defend the Azovstal factory, one of the last strongholds of resistance in the city targeted by the bombings of Moscow.

And then it was expected, and it is now confirmed, *Plus Belle la vie* is over. The popular soap opera of France 3 will stop due to a lack of audience. It had been broadcast since 2004. Filming will continue until September before a final shutdown at the end of the year.
