The government wants to abolish the television license fee this year. It was a campaign promise made by Emmanuel Macron. This means 138 euros will be saved for households - A way to support the purchasing power of the French. The TV license fee brings in more than 3 billion euros per year to the State. The mechanism that will replace this method of financing public broadcasting has not yet been clarified.

Eric Zemmour has chosen the Var for the legislative elections. He is running in the 4th constituency, in Saint-Tropez. He has planned to go to Cogolin at the end of the afternoon for a first meeting in front of the militants of his party. His party "Reconquête" will present a total of 550 candidates for the ballot on June 12th and 19th.

The case concerning Eric Zemmour is dismissed by the Paris Court of Appeal. He was prosecuted for "disputing a crime against humanity". The former candidate had affirmed three years ago, on CNews, that the Marshal Pétain had saved French Jews during the Second World War. Eric Zemmour had already benefited from an acquittal during his trial in first instance, but the prosecution had appealed.

Will Finland join NATO? The Finnish president wants membership "without delay". The country's official decision will be announced on Sunday. Russia, which shares a 1,300 km of border with Finland, is, however, firmly opposed to this membership. For the Kremlin spokesman, such a scenario would "certainly" be a threat to Russia.
