"We share the shock and pain of the American people", said Emmanuel Macron. The French President expressed his solidarity in the aftermath of the shooting that took place in an elementary school in the United States. The assailant was shot and killed by the police. A few hours after the tragedy, Joe Biden spoke, calling for action to "take on the gun lobby". Even Pope Francis reacted, saying he was "heartbroken" after this tragedy.

In France, the prosecution is taking its time in the Damien Abad case. To date, the court has not followed up on the rape charges against the Minister of Solidarity. The prosecution explains that it cannot identify the victim which prevents them from carrying out a detailed hearing.

Drivers may no longer lose points when they only slightly exceed speeding limits. The reflection is in any case open to the Ministry of the Interior. This would concern small speeding infractions of less than 5 kilometers per hour above the limit. The idea would then be to continue to sanction them with a fine but without impacting the points on their drivers' licenses.
