It's been 100 days since the war in Ukraine began. Moscow considers that it has reached some of its objectives and Russia continues to step up its offensive in the East of the country and the in the region of Dombass. The city of Severo-Donestk is now controlled by the kremlin at 80%.

Meanwhile, Volodymyr Zelensky remains hopeful: "The victory will be ours", said the Ukrainian president in a short video filmed in front of the presidential administration building in Kiev. In a message posted on twitter, he also thanked Europe for having implemented a new set of sanctions against Russia, starting with an embargo on almost all Russian oil.

In Germany, at least 3 people have died in the derailment of a regional train in Bavaria, which occurred for a reason that is still unknown. Rescue operations are still in progress.

In the United Kingdom, the ceremony lasted a little over an hour. A mass was celebrated today in St. Paul's Cathedral in London for the Queen's Jubilee. Elisabeth II was absent, on the other hand, Prince Harry and his wife Meghan were present. This was their first public appearance since their departure for the United States.

As for soccer, a week after the incidents on the sidelines of the Champions League final at the Stade de France, authorities do not want to relive the same scenario this evening. The French team faces Denmark at 8:45 p.m. The League of Nations game is placed under very high security. More than 2,000 police and gendarmes will be mobilized, including 650 specialists in fighting delinquency.

And then watch out for thunderstorms in the SouthWest of France. 10 departments are placed under orange weather alert this evening. The alert runs from the Landes to Aveyron via Haute-Garonne and the Pyrénées Atlantiques.
