Exhausted, disillusioned, but not resigned - caregivers demonstrated today to ask for more resources in hospitals. They denounce, once again, a system out of breath. The flash mission ordered by Emmanuel Macron to resolve the emergency crisis did not calm their anger. In Paris, around a hundred caregivers gathered in front of the Ministry of Health early this afternoon.

The former CEO of Orpea is being heard since this morning on suspicions of insider trading. He is accused of having sold nearly 600,000 euros in shares before the publication of the book "Les Fossoyeurs". The book denounces mistreatments that occur in the Ehpad of his group. Yves Le Masne is auditioned by the gendarmes of the Paris Research Section.

And no indictment for the three police officers placed in police custody. They were heard after the death of the passenger of a car following a refusal to comply on Saturday in Paris. The officers were finally released. On the other hand, the public prosecutor did open a judicial investigation.

Financial aid for the most modest households will be paid at the start of the school year to help with the inflation, as announced by Elisabeth Borne. The Prime Minister also stated that the discount on fuels will be extended until the end of the summer. A new system will then be put in place at the beginning of the school year and will be intended for those who drive long distances each day to go to work.

And you have probably noticed, gasoline prices exceeded 2 euros last week in France. 2 euros and 10 cents on average for unleaded 95, according to figures from the Ministry of Ecological Transition. Diesel gasoline has also made strong progress, reaching 1 euro 96, which is its highest since March.

And then in soccer: a chapter is closing for FC Metz. The team was just relegated to second league. According to the newspaper *l'Equipe*, coach Frédéric Antonetti will leave his position even though he still had two years left. A foreign sports director is expected to be appointed in the coming days.
