The Supreme Court of the United States revoked the constitutional right to abortion. Each American state now has the possibility of prohibiting women from having an abortion - A situation that the country was experiencing until 1973. Former US President Barack Obama accuses the Supreme Court of having "attacked the fundamental freedoms of millions of American women".

Emmanuel Macron wants "constructive majorities" with "all the government parties". He said this at the end of the European Council. He takes the example of Italy and Germany, where the leaders govern without having an absolute majority.

Salah Abdeslam "did not shoot any victims". The lawyers of the main suspect of the attacks of November 13 are at the stand today, after two weeks devoted to the defense of the 14 defendants. His lawyers highlight the fact that Salah Abdeslam finally gave up blowing himself up in a bar in the 13th arrondissement. Incompressible criminal imprisonment was requested.

One year in prison, including 8 months of a suspended sentence was requested in the appeal trial of the former directors of France Télécom. The former CEO Didier Lombard and others are accused of having "designed and put in place" a harassment policy that led employees to commit suicide.

As the seventh wave of the epidemic is gaining momentum, calls from the Ministry of Health have visibly paid off. The number of appointments for booster doses has been increasing for the past few days. Wednesday and Thursday, more than 22,000 people booked a time slot on Doctolib each day, which is almost three times more than during the previous weeks.

And they are asking for a general increase in wages: The SNCF unions are calling for a national strike day on July 6. According to the CGT, SUD-Rail and the CFDT, the railway workers are hit hard by inflation and suffer a net and strong decline in their purchasing power. They are calling for a revaluation of salaries and bonuses.
