The new government of Elisabeth Borne is meeting right now for a first council of ministers. The Ministers took office this afternoon with the traditional transfer of power. Earlier, it was the new Minister of Health François Braun who succeeded Brigitte Bourguignon. François Braun called for mobilization to renovate French hospitals.

This new government is made up of 21 men and 21 women. Olivier Véran is now its spokesperson, in place of Olivia Grégoire and the Ministry of Ecological Transition is entrusted to Christophe Béchu. As for Damien Abad, accused of sexual assault, he is no longer minister in charge of Solidarity and is replaced by the director of the Red Cross, Jean-Christophe Combe.

In this context, Elisabeth Borne is not expected to submit to the vote of confidence of the MPs after her general policy speech on Wednesday. The announcement must be made after the Council of Ministers.

A complaint for "sexual harassment" has been filed against the MP of *La France Insoumise* Eric Coquerel. The complaint has been filed by Sophie Tissier, who had publicly denounced an "offensive and harassing" behavior of the MP. The events supposedly occurred in 2014, during a party at the Left Party's summer university in Grenoble. Eric Coquerel fiercely denies these accusations.

And then in soccer: The formalization of the arrival of Christophe Galtier at the PSG is imminent. The club will organize a press conference tomorrow afternoon to present its new coach. The former coach of Nice is expected to stay for at least two years.
