The Nupes is ready for battle. The four groups of the alliance of the left alliance: socialists, communists, *insoumis* and ecologists, will vote for the vote of no confidence against Elisabeth Borne. However, the vote of no confidence has a very slim chance of succeeding since les *Républicains* and the *Rassemblement National* have announced that they will not vote for it. Tomorrow Elisabeth Borne will deliver her general policy speech to the National Assembly. The speech will be followed by a debate between the different political forces.

Jean-Marc Reiser is finally learned his fate. The Court of Bas-Rhin sentences him to life in prison, with a 22-year security period, for the murder of Sophie Le Tan. Sophie Le Tan was a student to whom he had shown his apartment almost four years ago near Strasbourg. The victim's family said they were "satisfied" and "relieved" with this verdict.

A man is actively wanted in the Hautes-Pyrénées. He is suspected of a double homicide by firearm near Tarbes. The bodies of two teachers were found last night at the home of one of the victims and the suspect was seen by neighbors at the time of the events. We do not know, for now, the motivations of the shooter.

709,000 baccalaureate candidates will get their results today. For those who did not pass, retakes will begin tomorrow. According to the Minister of Education Pap Ndiaye, the first trends show a declining passing rate. The official figures will be communicated tonight.

"I put aside my Marseille origins", were the words of Christophe Galtier, new coach of the PSG. He was presented this afternoon by the president of the club Nasser al-Khelaïfi. Christophe Galtier will lead his first training session this afternoon, at the Camp des Loges.
