An appeal for witnesses was broadcast by the gendarmerie to find the man suspected of having shot and killed two teachers in the Hautes-Pyrénées early this week. The ex-partner of the suspect and her new partner were murdered. The fugitive's motorcycle was found in northern Spain and the search continues on both sides of the Pyrenees.

Japan is in shock after the murder of the former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe. He was shot in the middle of the street during a public meeting. Transported in absolute urgency to the hospital, the former leader finally died of his injuries. The shooter was arrested. He is a former member of the Japanese navy and confessed to being the killer. Emmanuel Macron declared via Twitter that "Japan is losing a great Prime Minister".

The High Authority for Health has communicated recommendations regarding monkey pox: The authority recommends preventive vaccination for those most at risk of exposure. In particular homosexual men, who represent a large part of contaminations. This vaccination was requested by many associations. The Ministry of Health is expected to announce this afternoon if it follows this recommendation. There are nearly 600 confirmed cases of monkey pox in France, more than half of which in Ile-de-France.

Parisian airports are finally operating smoothly. The employees voted the end of the strike, in time to avoid a difficult situation for those going on vacation. After more than a week of negotiations, they accepted the management's latest proposal, which is a general increase of 3%. But beware, unions are warning that other strikes may take place this summer, this time in relation to the workforce.

And to finish, the riders of the Tour de France have started to climb. This afternoon's seventh stage is between Tomblaine in Meurthe-et-Moselle and the Super Planche des Belles Filles in Haute-Saône.
