The departments of Hérault and Gard have switched to a red weather alert this evening. Météo France calls for Extreme caution in the south of France as violent storms are expected. The end of this episode is expected at around 10 p.m., but already, in these departments, the damage is considerable.

And to the north of Montpellier, in Saint-Clément-de-Rivière, the children of a nursery school had to be transferred, for safety reasons, to an elementary school. 25 departments of a large half East of the country, from the Ardennes to the Haute-Loire, remain under orange alert for thunderstorms.

Also in the news this evening, Elisabeth Borne announces 8,500 additional police officers and gendarmes in five years in France. The announcement was made by the Prime Minister during the inauguration of a police station in the center of Paris. From next year, 3,000 additional people will join the ranks of the police. Tomorrow the security bill will be presented to the Council of Ministers.

The conclusions of the experts of the International Atomic Energy Agency were communicated following their visit to the Zaporizhia nuclear power plant. They call for the establishment of a security zone and consider that the current situation is "untenable". The Ukrainian power station, occupied for several months by Russian forces, is the target of regular bombings.

And then soccer, after the controversy over PSG's air travel, it's time for the game. The Parisians face Juventus Turin tonight at the Parc des Princes for First Champions League match of the season. Kickoff at 9 p.m.
