The British Royal family is at the bedside of Elizabeth II as her state of health is concerning. Her doctors recommend that the sovereign be placed under medical surveillance. "The whole country is concerned" by the news about the Queen's health, said the new Prime Minister Liz Truss. The Archbishop of Canterbury sends his prayers to the 96-year-old Queen. The traditional Changing of the Guard in front of Buckingham Palace will not take place tomorrow morning.

The European Central Bank raises its rates by 0.75 points, which is unprecedented. This major decision should help fight inflation.

And Emmanuel Macron confirms the launch of a citizens' convention on end-of-life care, which was a campaign promise. The contours of this convention will be specified next Tuesday, when the Head of State will receive a report of the ethics committee.

A police officer is in police custody in Nice. He is Accused of having killed the driver of a stolen car yesterday, after he had refused to comply. The passenger of the car, arrested at the time of the tragedy, was also placed in police custody for attempted homicide on a person holding public authority. The police officer is currently being heard by the IGPN.

And a 19-year-old man is sentenced to a suspended fine of 2,000 euros after a racist tweet against Kylian Mbappé. The message was published on the social network following the elimination of the French team from the Euro against Switzerland. The defendant risked up to one year in prison.

This is a first worldwide: A city in the Netherlands bans advertising for meat in public spaces. According to the environmental party of the city Haarlem, the population should no longer be encouraged to consume meat. This measure will be enacted in 2024, after the addition of meat to a list of products considered harmful to the climate. It is worth noting that meat eaters represent 95% of the population of Netherlands.
