Edinburgh bid farewell to Elizabeth II. A religious ceremony in honor of the Queen is currently being held in the Saint-Gilles Cathedral, in the presence of Charles III. The Queen's coffin was accompanied by a procession throughout the city. The coffin will be displayed to the public for 24 hours for the Scots to pay their last respects to their queen. Sunday evening at the entire United Kingdom will observe a minute of silence.

In this atmosphere of unity since the death of the sovereign, a dissonant voice was heard. That of a young woman arrested in Edinburgh. She was carrying a sign calling for the abolition of the monarchy. She was arrested and will soon have to appear before a judge. The text of the young woman included an insult.

Ukrainian forces announce that they have liberated more than 20 localities within 24 hours, as part of the counter-offensive against the Russian army. The counter-offensive supposedly allowed for the recovery of 500 square kilometers. The President Volodymyr Zelensky accuses Moscow of having hit the electricity network in retaliation. Yesterday evening, the recaptured area suffered vast power cuts.

The decline is confirmed in gas stations: Last week the price of a liter of diesel fell by 2.5 cents, to settle on average at 1 euro and 75 cents per liter. A decrease of more than 4 cents for unleaded was reported, with an average of 1 euro and 50 cents per liter. This price for unleaded had not been reached since of May 2021.

As the mushroom season returns, ANSES warns of the risk of poisoning: The National Health Security Agency calls for vigilance, after more than sixty cases of poisoning have been identified since the beginning of the month. The cases were mainly caused by the confusion between an edible species and a toxic one. Mushroom poisoning has caused four deaths last year in France.

And then did Squid Game go down in history? The South Korean series is in the running to win the statuette for best drama series of the year at the Emmy Awards tomorrow night. It would be the first time that a non-English language series wins the prestigious distinction. Squid Game will be opposed to other series, including Succession and Stranger things.
