From January 1, a financial incentive will be granted to those who carpool. The measure is confirmed by the Minister of Transport Clément Beaune. Among the other measures of the energy sobriety plan, is a 150-million-euro budget devoted to the renovation of public buildings, and heating will be limited to 19 degrees in offices.

For its part, the FNSEA is asking the State for help in the food sector, as farmers are hit hard by the energy crisis. The agricultural union fears that without a support system, thousands of jobs will be cut. According to the FNSEA, agricultural production costs have soared by nearly 27% over one year.

Early childhood professionals are on strike today in nurseries. Rallies and demonstrations are organized in around sixty cities to denounce a real shortage of qualified professionals, linked to wages deemed insufficient.

The investigation into the assassination of Samuel Paty is over. The anti-terrorist investigating judges have closed their investigations, almost a year after the murder of the teacher in the Yvelines. Fourteen people are indicted in this case and the terrorist had been shot dead by the police.

Christian Quesada will stay in prison for 1 more month! He appeared today before the sentence enforcement judge of Perpignan. The former star of the game *Les 12 Coups de Midi* had been imprisoned since last week for not having respected his judicial supervision, following his sentence to three years in prison for corruption of minors and dissemination of child pornography.
